This merit scholarship is established in memory of Richard Peter Carr, Jr. who was committed to peace and social justice, and to encourage aspiring APA leaders to actualize a diverse democracy.

The RP & JL Carr Social Justice Scholarship is:

- A merit award to a current full-time graduate student or a student entering full-time graduate studies related to peace and social justice, i.e. law, public policy, political science, community development.
- A non-renewable \$2000 award.
- OCA-WI is the final judge for the award.

Eligibility:

- Current OCA-WI membership (application form available at http://www.ocawi.org/oca/index.php?p=3).
- U.S. citizenship or permanent residency.
- Full-time enrollment at an accredited university graduate program in the 2012-2013 academic year.
